**If Procedure normally requires staff to wear a procedure mask

- continue to wear procedure mask under CAPR
 - the CAPR protects staff from patient droplets
 - the procedure mask protects the patient from staff droplets being pushed out of CAPR positive pressure
- You do NOT need to wear a procedure mask with an N95

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
